



Annual Notification of FERPA Rights

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a federal law that gives parents the right to have access to their children's education records, the right to seek to have the records amended, and the right to have some control over the disclosure of personally identifiable information from the education records. A school must annually notify parents of their rights under FERPA. 34 CFR 99.37.

Schools are required to provide the notice by *"any means that are reasonably likely to inform parents of their rights. These means could include publication in a school activities calendar, newsletter, student handbook, or **on a school's website.**"¹
